 - b. Entry fees and membership fee is waived for all junior classes, \$10 membership fee to adult classes
2. All livestock and crops must be on the grounds by 11:00 am and shall not be released until 4:30 pm. ****NOTE: TO MELBOURNE 4-H BEEF CLUB YOUR ACHIEVEMENT DAY WILL START AT 12:00 PM****
3. (a) All cattle exhibitors must have their entries accurately documented, ensure their livestock is eligible, entered and shown in the proper section
 - (b) - crops – NO ROOTS or your entry will be disqualified.
 CATTLE AND CROPS – entries must be provided to the administration staff, by **11:00 AM on the day of the show. (Register in the Fair Board Hall)**
 - (c) Jr and Open Fair – all entries must be placed in the hall, entry tags completed and attached to each exhibit on **Thurs Aug 15 6-8pm or Friday Aug 16 10am-12:00pm**
Entry tags available at local libraries or committee members
****Entry Form for ALL exhibitors is at the back of the Fairbook must be a complete listing of all entries, keeping Jr Fair entries separate****
4. All exhibitors shall exercise safety precautions for their livestock, people, and property.
5. All exhibitors shall park their vehicles in an orderly manner as directed by the appropriate MAS Committee member.

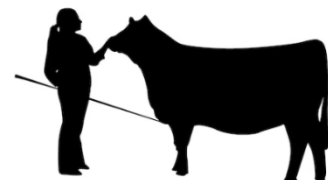

There will be 2 competitions open to crops produced to **both SWM & Strathroy Caradoc Residents.**

1. Field crop must be a minimum of 5 acres, signage will be provided to you by Melbourne Agricultural Society.
2. Judging will commence the week of Aug 5th (week before Cattle Show) for the field portion of the competition (approx. 100 points of total score)
3. To complete the Field Crop competition, samples from field must be on the grounds by 11:00am on Aug 17th, **NO ROOTS attached, or your entry will be disqualified**, judging will commence at 1pm, and shall not be released until 4:30pm (20 points of total score)

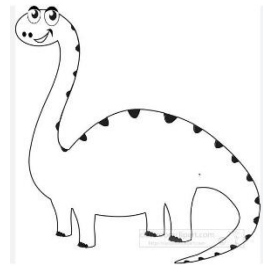

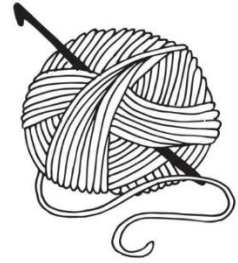
